Two-Way Radio Etiquette

- 1. Don't turn the volume up all the way. It's usually easier to hear if it's turned lower.
- 2. Press the "Talk" button a second or so *before* you begin speaking. It takes the radio some time to begin transmitting. This will prevent your first word from being cut off.
- 3. Hold the "Talk" button a second or so *after* you finish speaking. This will prevent your last word from being cut off.
- 4. Identify yourself and who you are speaking to with each transmission. Say for example, "Scott Glauser to command center".
- 5. If your radio does not transmit a tone when you release the "Talk" button, you should say "over" after each transmission so others will know when you have finished speaking.
- 6. Speak clearly and slowly. It's sometimes difficult for others to understand because radios aren't as clear as telephones.
- 7. Hold the radio two to three inches away from your mouth and speak directly into the microphone.
- 8. Remove the batteries for storage as they may leak over time and damage the radio.
